



UK Shared Prosperity Fund – Digital Capital Grant Application Information including Digital Green Spaces

The Digital Hubs programme has secured funding as part of the UK Shared Prosperity Fund which will allow community-based organisations to apply for a capital grant to improve their Digital Equipment or infrastructure. The final round of funding is now open, the maximum amount of funding a community organisation can apply for is £5000.

Please note that the final round is slightly different as approximately £20,000 will be ringfenced for organisations that can create and or improve Green Spaces. This can be in a variety of innovative ways to capture Neighbourhood Improvements through digital media:-

- Digital Photos and a story board
- Digital Story telling e.g. Podcast
- Digital Photography
- Digital Videography -TikTok/YouTube video to capture the journey

In order to receive funding, you must be registered with the **Kirklees Grant Access Point**. Please register if you have not already done so. [Register with the Grants Access Point | Kirklees Council](#)

To apply for the digital grant, organisations will have to outline how they will use the capital grant to improve digital equipment, infrastructure or green space. Why this upgrade is required and estimate how many residents the upgrades will assist monthly. All costs will be assessed by Kirklees council and must be deemed as fair and reasonable. A typical example of improvements is located at the end of this document in Appendix A and Appendix B.

Please note this grant is for improvements to facilities that end users/local residents (within Kirklees) will benefit from, unfortunately this grant does not support work related IT equipment for staff use.

Organisations will have to evidence how their digital infrastructure/community gardens or green spaces has been improved to meet UKSPF outcomes.

To measure this outcome, it is expected that organisations will conduct before and after surveys, before and after photos and a case study. The sample surveyed should be large enough to enable accurate results based on the centre usage size. It must be ensured that respondents are representative of the local population as a whole, in terms of age, sex, etc.

For Example:

Improvement needed: The centre has Wi-Fi available to users through a standard broadband connection, survey captures users indicating that it is not reliable and the centre reports that footfall and offer to support residents has decreased or is at risk.

Result: Funding is approved for the installation of Fibre Broadband. Survey captures users reporting that the Wi-Fi is more reliable and faster with footfall either increasing with services no longer at risk or additional services now available.

Improvement needed: A Community Organisation would like to install 2 raised beds/planters and they will capture this through photos and a storyboard, they will need a new digital camera & laptop to capture this.

Result: Funding is approved for the installation of 2 new raised beds and a camera/laptop to capture this on and provide future use for community. The before and after surveys capture this and the case study details how this has had a positive impact on the residents' lives.

Applications:- Applications will be reviewed and evaluated for:-

- Confirmation of GAP registration
- Evidence base for improvements submitted are proportionate and can be implemented within a reasonable timescale (within 6 weeks for equipment purchased and within 12 weeks for any external contractors)
- In the event we receive more applications than we have funding for, all eligible applications will be approved on a first come basis.

- In the event you are not successful you will be able to apply for further funding rounds.

Appendix A – Digital Infrastructure

The below is an example of the type of improvement that we would expect the capital digital fund to support. This list is not explicit nor exhaustive and should be used as a guide only.

Equipment:-

- Network server
- Desktop PC's/Laptops/Chromebooks
- New software
- New monitors
- IT Peripherals (mouse, keyboards etc)
- Smart TV
- Interactive White Screen
- Computer chairs/desks
- Printers

Infrastructure:-

- Installation of broadband/upgrade to Fibre
- New or additional Wi-Fi connector/access points
- New or Improved networking/trunking
- Networking hardware
- Hubs/Routers/Switches
- Fibre optic cabling

Appendix B - Digital Green Spaces

The below is an example of the type of improvement that we would expect the capital digital fund to support and the digital equipment that could be used to document the journey. This list is not explicit nor exhaustive and should be used as a guide only.

Provide Educational Opportunities:

Set up gardening classes for community members, especially children. Teach them about planting, bugs, diseases, and the joy of growing food. [These experiences build confidence and connect young gardeners with each other¹](#).

Digital element:- Involve your teens, TikTok teens and tomatoes?

Make Spaces for the Elderly:

Create cozy corners with fragrant plants that evoke memories. [Mint, lavender, and other herbs can trigger reminiscences and encourage conversations among older visitors¹.](#)

Remember the Birds and the Bees:

Designate areas for birdhouses, bee-friendly flowers, and butterfly gardens. These not only beautify the space but also support local wildlife and pollinators.

Plant a Giving Garden:

Dedicate a section of the garden to growing produce for local food banks or shelters. Involve volunteers in planting, tending, and harvesting. It's a beautiful way to give back to the community.

Grow Communal Fruit Trees:

Plant fruit trees that everyone can enjoy. [Apples, pears, or cherries can provide fresh, nutritious snacks for all community members¹.](#)
